A man was yesterday praised for saving two disabled men attacked on a busy street – but others who failed to step in to help were condemned for their apathy.

Two 26-year-old men - one virtually blind and the other with cerebral palsy⁽¹⁾ - were mugged in broad daylight in the town centre of Torquay⁽²⁾ last September.

Former fireman Mark Mallen spotted the incident 50 yards away and raced to help. But others just watched as he bravely took on the two attackers.

Mark, a 39-year-old builder from Paignton, (2) said, "The man held their heads and was banging them together. The woman was kicking them and trying to grab their bags."

"There were quite a few people around but no one went to their aid. When I got there, I shouted at them and grabbed hold of them, but still no one came to help me. They started on me and there was a bit of a scuffle until the police came."

Mark was yesterday awarded £50 from public funds in reward for his actions in the incident. High Sheriff Page-Turner said it was a sad accusation on society that no one had offered help.

"I don't think enough people help out in a situation like this. It took a lot of bravery and courage for Mr Mallen to step in, when he could well end up with a knife in his back, but even when he tried to stop this attack no one went to his assistance," the High Sheriff said at the presentation.

Mr Mallen said it was a sad sign of the times that nobody wanted to get involved because they didn't know what would happen to them. "If a few more people had the courage to step in and do something, maybe not so many people would commit these types of offences," he said.

The two assailants, who pleaded guilty to assault with intent to rob, were each sentenced to four years in jail when they appeared at Exeter⁽³⁾ Crown Court last year.
