Julie's family owns a restaurant in the village of Boscastle, in Cornwall. The village was struck by violent floods on Monday 16 August. Julie is 13. This is her account of what happened.

"I was at our restaurant but I wasn't worried by the river getting higher. I didn't think anything as bad was going to happen – sometimes the river gets a bit high. Then it started to overflow. Then all of a sudden the water was at the entrance of the restaurant. My mum told me to go upstairs – other people came to shelter there as well.

We stayed up there for a while and watched the cars lifted up by the water. It was really scary. The cars were swept along the street. A big van went down and hit a lamppost and a wire connected to our house snapped. It nearly hit us as we stood by the window.

The front door broke and then the water rushed in and got high really fast.

We tried to find an escape route. We thought about climbing out the window into next door but realised Honey, our white Alsatian dog, couldn't get out there.

Then the water started to go down very slowly. The firemen came to our rescue – the water was now waist high. One of the chefs carried Honey.

As I walked out, I was looking around – the bar was broken, there were tables everywhere and all our food was floating round the kitchen. I just broke down in tears.

We stayed there for a while. It was dark and there was no electricity so we used candles. We then headed to The Napoleon Inn, where we stayed. My aunt and cousin live there.

Every time I closed my eyes, I could see it all happening again. I couldn't believe it had happened – it felt like a dream.

I haven't gone back to the house yet. My dad went back to get the pets - my cat, my hamsters and my rabbit. I had locked them in the highest room".
